Permit Application 56-14-81HR: The Board reviewed the permit application for 56-14-81HR from Hickory Sand Ranch LP for 150 acre-feet at a maximum rate of 500 gpm for irrigation. A motion was made by Gay and seconded by Bill to approve 56-14-81HR for 150 AF at 500 gpm. Motion passed.

Permit Application City of Mason (56-23-101, 56-23-104, 56-23-111, 56-15-712, 56-15-716, 56-23-115, 56-56-121, and 56-23-110): The Board reviewed permit application for the City of Mason to increase permit from 499 AF/year to 750 AF/year, all city wells in conjunction in order to meet current and future demands. A motion was made by Bill and seconded by Gay to approve the City of Mason permit application for 750 AF/year, all city wells in conjunction. Motion passed.

Report on District Activities: David presented the District Activities Report for January 11, 2024 (report attached).

**Report on Legislative Activities:** No written report was presented.

**Management Plan:** We are still waiting for the Management Plan to be returned from the State. No action was taken.

**Election 2024:** The Board reviewed Election Procedure Order 24-01 and a motion was made by Gay and seconded by Bill to approve. Motion passed. Order signed.

The Board reviewed Election Order 24-02. The time for Early Voting was changed from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The change was made on the order and initialed. With the change to time, a motion was made by Gay and seconded by Bill to call the election for Precincts 3 and 4 and approve said order. Motion passed. Order signed with change noted.

**Adjourn.** A motion was made by Bill and seconded by Gay to adjourn. Motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 6:38 p.m.

- 4. Renewed CNB CD for 12 months at 5% interest. CBMason offered 5% on 3 months but lower for longer terms. BNB offered 3% on 12 months.
- 5. 2023 Rainfall Reports have been posted online. Average across the District was 21.8"
